#### Period Positive Campaign a Success!

Period Positive supplies were delivered to local schools including Uniontown, Laurel Highlands, Albert Gallatin, Connellsville, Vo Tech, Brownsville, Turkeyfoot, and Adelphoi. Over 1,000 individual pads and 350 tampons were distributed, and we still have 2,000 pads and 500 tampons remaining to distribute to local middle schools. This initiative was a huge success, with approximately 17,000 products collected at 24 participating local businesses. Linda's office was overflowing with donations! We'll continue building on this momentum to support menstrual equity in our community.

- By identifying and focusing on a need of women and girls, this woman has contributed to the improvement of their lives.
- Although clubs may honor a woman for a lifetime of good work, the majority of the work should have occurred within the past two years.




Mary Lenora Hajduk
